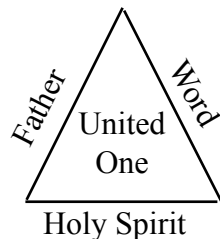
Our three lines represent the three persons of the God head. They work together as one.

No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.
Matt 6:24

When we unite together to do a work, there must be ONE master. There is no loyalty if there is no master. God is a God of organization. He has a plan in which to get the work accomplished. Satan is confusion. Satan is self serving and lives for the "I will" of his life. God's will is not self serving, but is worked through LOVE (ICor. 13). God's way runs smoothly. The Father, the Word and the Holy Spirit are all God, but the Father is the master of the Godhead and will remain so after all things are put under Jesus feet. The authority structure is in the heavens and will always remain in operation. You cannot accomplish the work of God outside of the authority structure! To build your work on the authority structure is to build your work on the rock. To build your work outside of the authority structure is to build your work on the sand. It will fall! An equilateral triangle is a great way to picture the Godhead, the home and the church. All three sides are equal and are connected to one another. They are one, working in and through one another. In Philippians 2:6 Jesus said while being in the form of God, He thought it was not robbery to say He was equal to God. All three are equally God, but they all three work through the WILL of the Father. The Word and the Holy Spirit are both submitted to working the Will of the Father and do not work independently of the Father. Jesus said if you have seen Him, you have seen the Father. Only with God do you find equality! He is not a respecter of persons.

We are told in Ephesians 5:21 that we are to submit ourselves one to another. In order to operate a home in the same manner that the Godhead operates, each person must submit to having the other work through them and they must submit to working through the other ones' life also. This is a work of faith because man is not trust worthy!!! By opening up your life to someone else you are putting your life at risk. To work within someone else's life is to put their life at risk. 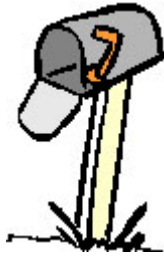
Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:

Talking about your children is a very touchy thing to do, and I knew that when I wrote last month about my children. I knew as I wrote about how blessed I had been with my children, someone reading about my blessing was going through a rough time with their child or children and I did not want to rub my blessing in. Sure enough, I heard from a suffering mother. At first I felt terrible and then I thanked the Lord that she shared with me where she was with her children.

As Paul Harvey said, "Now for the rest of the story." Life is a race with hurdles. I feel I have faced my share of hurdles, as I am sure you have faced your share, but the Lord has not called me to go through horrible things with my children. Hard things, yes! Horrible things, no! But, I could tomorrow, because that's life. Have my children struggled with sin? Yes! Have my children struggled with their daily walk? Yes! Jerry and I have fought as many battles as any parent, but when we sought God for wisdom, He was always faithful to give us the power and wisdom to work it through for good. Does that mean that Jerry and I were smarter than some other parents? Not on your life! It means, after we did our part and our work, God put His blessing on it. If God blesses, we are blessed and nothing can be added to it or taken away. If God does not bless, it does not mean that we have been forsaken, it means the work is not finished!!! He is still working on one or all of the parties involved.

I know that, whatsoever God doeth, it shall be for ever: nothing can be put to it, nor any thing taken from it: and God doeth it, that men should fear before him.

We are to praise God for His wonderful works among men! But while I am experiencing the mighty hand of God's blessings in one part of my life, another brother or sister are experiencing the heavy hand of God's trying in their life in that same area. Satan will hand you something you desire really bad at the beginning of a work, but the end is "death". God allows us to work, sweat, pray and seek, then He pours the blessings on.

If you have not yet seen the hand of blessing upon your work with your children, my first words to you are "HOLD ON"! Don't give up! Where there is breath there is hope!

My next words to you would be to allow the Lord to instruct your life and show you what you have done or can do to make a difference. We are only usable to the Lord when we allow Him to purge us the way we hope He will purge our children. Just because we wanted to be the best parents in the world, and just because we spent all we had to do that, does not mean that we did all things well. Will we allow the Lord to point out our deficiencies and open our eyes to our lives? This is the hard part.

You may be like Job! Most are afraid to compare themselves with Job, because Job went through so great a testing. Any testing that comes to glorify God, and not to bring sin to light, is a work like Job's. Job was not the cause of his testing and you may not be the cause either, but be sure you are willing to be the cause if God says so.

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THE PILGRIMS AND AMERICA'S FIRST THANKSGIVING

The Pilgrims, who celebrated the first thanksgiving in America, were fleeing religious persecution in their native England. In 1609 a group of Pilgrims left England for the religious freedom in Holland where they lived and prospered. After a few years their children were speaking Dutch and had become attached to the Dutch way of life. This worried the Pilgrims. They considered the Dutch frivolous and their ideas a threat to their children's education and morality.

So they decided to leave Holland and travel to the New World. Their trip was financed by a group of English investors, the Merchant Adventurers. It was agreed that the Pilgrims would be given passage and supplies in exchange for their working for their backers for 7 years.

On September 6, 1620 the Pilgrims set sail for the New World on a ship called the *Mayflower*. They sailed from Plymouth, England and aboard were 44 Pilgrims, who called themselves the "Saints", and 66 others, whom the Pilgrims called the "Strangers."

The long trip was cold and damp and took 65 days. Since there was the danger of fire on the wooden ship, the food had to be eaten cold. Many passengers became sick and one person died by the time land was sighted on November 10th.

The long trip led to many disagreements between the "Saints" and the "Strangers". After land was sighted a meeting was held and an agreement was worked out, called the *Mayflower Compact*, which guaranteed equality and unified the two groups. They joined together and named themselves the "Pilgrims."

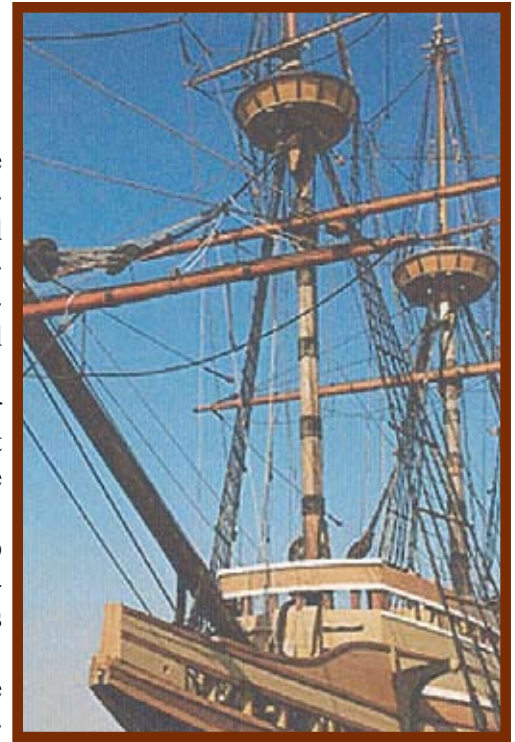
Although they had first sighted land off Cape Cod they did not settle until they arrived at Plymouth, which had been named by Captain John Smith in 1614. It was there that the Pilgrims decided to settle. Plymouth offered an excellent harbor. A large brook offered a resource for fish. The Pilgrims biggest concern was attack by the local Native American Indians. But the *Patuxets* were a peaceful group and did not prove to be a threat.

The first winter was devastating to the Pilgrims. The cold, snow and sleet were exceptionally heavy, interfering with the workers as they tried to construct their settlement. March brought warmer weather and the health of the Pilgrims improved, but many had died during the long winter. Of the 110 Pilgrims and crew who left England, less than 50 survived the first winter.

On March 16, 1621, what was to become an important event took place, and Indian brave walked into the Plymouth settlement. The Pilgrims were frightened until the Indian called out "Welcome" (in English).

His name was Samoset and he was an *Abnaki* Indian. He had learned English from the captains of fishing boats that had sailed off the coast. After staying the night Samoset left the next day. He soon returned with another Indian named Squanto who spoke better English than Samoset. Squanto told the Pilgrims of his voyages across the ocean and his visits to England and Spain. It was in England where he had learned English.

Squanto's importance to the Pilgrims was enormous and it can be said that they would not have survived without his help. It was Squanto who taught the Pilgrims how to tap the maple trees for sap. He taught them which plants were poisonous and which had medicinal powers. He taught them how to plant the Indian corn by heaping the earth into low mounds with several seeds and fish in each mound. The decaying fish fertilized the corn. He also taught them



to plant other crops with the corn.

The harvest in October was very successful and the Pilgrims found themselves with enough food to put away for the winter. There was corn, fruits and vegetables, fish to be packed in salt, and meat to be cured over smoky fires.

The Pilgrims had much to celebrate, they had built homes in the wilderness, they had raised enough crops to keep them alive during the long coming winter, they were at peace with their Indian neighbors. They had beaten the odds and it was time to celebrate.

The Pilgrim Governor William Bradford proclaimed a day of thanksgiving to be shared by all the colonists and the neighboring Native Americans. They invited Squanto and the other Indians to join them for 3 days. They played games, ran races, marched and played drums. The Indians demonstrated their skills with the bow and arrow and the Pilgrims demonstrated their musket skills. Exactly when the festival took place is uncertain, but it is believed the celebration took place in mid-October.

The following year the Pilgrims harvest was not as bountiful, as they were still unused to growing the corn. During the year they had also

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It is not up to us, your friends, to tell you why God is allowing your trial. Only the Lord knows the answers to that.

When the Lord corrects me, I am usually shocked at what He has to say. I have found myself arguing with the Lord, telling Him it just isn't that way! This mother also made another statement to me saying, "My children are not where they are because of how I raised them." I would also disagree with this statement. They may not be doing what I taught them to do, but I do hold a great responsibility for the way in which they handle their lives.

After almost five years into my marriage my home was a disaster. I certainly was not trying to create a disaster. I was working as hard as I could to be a wife, a mother and a child of God and yet everything around me was falling in! Surely it wasn't my fault, was it? I was trying to fulfil the Word of God in my life and it was not working. What was wrong? Does God's Word not work, or was I missing something?

God's Word works, and you can take that to the bank. If it is between me and God's Word, it is me that has the problem. If God's Word is not coming to pass in your life, something in your work is missing or your not at the end yet.

For me, the problem was that I was doing the right things, without the right spirit. The letter of the law killeth. I was using the Word of God and it was killing my work because I only used it in letter and not in spirit. What a change in my life and my work when I began to let God's Spirit work through my life. Now I haven't done all things through that Spirit since then, but I did and still do, commit my life to living through that Spirit. When I fail, I quickly beg God to forgive me and restore me back to where I belong. I love what I see God do though the Spirit and I hate what happens when I walk in my flesh.

Parents are not responsible for the outcome of their children, but they are responsible for the raising of those children.

Last thought! God is perfect and He has rebellious children! Do not despair if you are working with a rebellious child. Love them as Christ loved us, saying, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." Some children struggle with life as a child, other children as a young adult, and others in the latter years. All are different. Timing has everything to do with where our children are today and where they will be tomorrow. Our job is to do today that which the Lord has given us to do, wherever we are in life, and wait upon the Lord to finish the work.

The Pilgrims and America's First Thanksgiving

shared their stored food with newcomers and the Pilgrims ran short of food.

The 3rd year brought a spring and summer that was hot and dry with the crops dying in the fields. Governor Bradford ordered a day of fasting and prayer, and it was soon thereafter that the rain came. To celebrate - November 29th of that year was proclaimed a day of thanksgiving. This date is believed to be the real true beginning of the present day Thanksgiving Day.

The custom of an annually celebrated thanksgiving, held after the harvest, continued through the years. During the American Revolution (late 1770's) a day of national thanksgiving was suggested by the Continental Congress.

In 1817 New York State had adopted Thanksgiving Day as an annual custom. By the middle of the 19th century many other states also celebrated a Thanksgiving Day. In 1863 President Abraham Lincoln appointed a national day of thanksgiving. Since then each president has issued a Thanksgiving Day proclamation, usually designating the fourth Thursday of each November as the holiday.

The Thanksgiving Turkey

Of all the Thanksgiving symbols the Turkey has become the most well known. The wild turkey is native to northern Mexico and the eastern United States.

Though there is no real evidence that turkey was served at the Pilgrim's first thanksgiving, in a book written by the Pilgrim's Governor Bradford he does make mention of wild turkeys. In a letter sent to England, another Pilgrim describes how the governor sent "four men out fowling" returning with turkeys, ducks and geese.
