SEED AND SOWERS; OR, TRACT DISTRIBUTION

How many there are who, humanly speaking, would never have heard the Gospel but for tracts. Sermons, addresses, personal dealing, the reading of books, all, of course, are means of grace and greatly blessed, but they still leave room for the tract. How often a man who would neither listen to preaching, nor open a religious book, has received a message from God through the agency of a tract or test.

A tract has this advantage, that it may be both written and read without distraction. A calm, well-thought-out, and well-arranged statement, calculated to arrest, impress and convince the careless, it does not repel by its length, and is willing to accommodate itself to the reader's convenience. At his leisure, when his mind is free; when circumstances are favorable; it may be in the silent watches of the night, on the mighty deep, upon the hillside, or the quiet country road, where no human voice disturbs, he reads his tract, and the Spirit makes it to him as the voice of God, calling to repentance and to newness of life.

Many and many a time has the truth contained in a tract proved as the "still small voice" which aroused the conscience, or the finely pointed and divinely guided arrow which has found its way between the joints of the harness, and produced conviction and conversion in the hitherto hard and unbelieving heart. It is certainly desirable that tracts should be attractive in appearance, and got up in such a way as is like to ensure their being preserved or circulated. Even though they should cost a little more, they are worth the money, because they are likely to last much longer, and to be circulated more readily, than the flimsy leaflets which too often, it is to be feared, meet the same fate as the handbills which are distributed in the streets.

Few Christians need grudge the price of good tracts, for surely few things in the present day are cheaper. Besides, there are always many of God's people who are willing to pay for tracts for those who are willing to distribute them; and no one who is really anxious to engage in this work need be long without a supply of good tracts to give. It is not so much the want of tracts that is felt, as the want of the necessary faith and courage on the part of God's people generally to make a more plentiful and prayerful use of them.

An excellent plan is to place texts, tracts, or little books in envelopes, which may or may not be closed, and which may be left in any sheltered spot where they are likely to be found before long. This sort of scattering may perhaps not commend itself so much to some as personal distribution, but, nevertheless, it has its place, and has had blessed results.

Those who are really anxious to lose no opportunity of doing good in this way will do well never to be without some precious seed to scatter in their walks abroad, or wherever they may happen to be. They should also remember that it has been said with truth that "a wise man makes more opportunities than he finds," and they should deeply and solemnly realize the fact that a lost opportunity may be a lost eternity to some poor soul.

Tracts may be dropped into a letter-box, or in an open door or window - may be left in the house, the shop, the waiting-room, the railway carriage, the cab, between the leaves of books, under a sheltering ledge, in a hole in the wall, on a garden seat, in a message-basket, a hat, or a pocket - anywhere, in fact, where they are likely to be found. Many opportunities will occur to those who look for them, and the outlook for original plans adds to the interest of the work. Possibly the finder might sometimes be impressed and induced to read by the very singularity of the place where the tract was found.

Dear Christian reader, if you have hitherto neglected this means of usefulness, so easy and yet so blessed in its results, resolve that you will do so no

longer, but that, from this time, you will constantly, prayerfully, and hopefully by this means sow the seed of the Word, and be assured a day will come when you will realize with great joy that your sowing was not in vain.

"Broadcast thy seed!

Although some portion may be found

**To fall on uncongenial ground,
Where sand, or shard, or stone may stay**

**Its coming into light of day;
Or when it comes, some pestilent air
May make it droop, and wither there**

**Be not discouraged; some will find
Congenial soil, and gently wind,

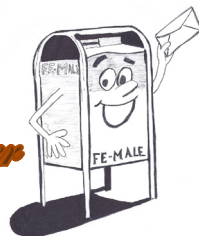

THE TRIAL OF YOUR FAITH!

Have you ever felt like everything was against what you were trying to accomplish? Is God trying your faith? Do you understand why He is trying your faith? Your faith is more precious than gold!!! Our faith is the most valuable possession we have been given. Jesus asked the question, "Will I find faith on earth?" When Jesus returns, the question is, will there be Christians who are living by faith and not by sight? If you were the only person living, would He find faith?

The first time I exercised faith, was the night of my salvation, when I decided to believe that God was the God He said He was in the Bible. The next test of my faith was the very next day, when God told me not to get married and I thought I knew more than He did, so I went right on with my plans. Needless to say, I failed that test of faith. The next great test of my faith was staying in my

marriage, when it looked like there was no hope for us. God had tried to spare me the trials, but Jerry or I neither one listened. We thought we could do all things!

The next step of faith was believing that God would forgive me for my disobedience and that He would take my mess and turn it to gold. Satan would sit on my shoulder and tell me that I would never be able to be in God's will again and that I would never be fit to be God's servant. Satan is a liar!!! God knew I would not listen to Him that day and He knew I would go right ahead and marry. God also knew that He could and would use my marriage to make and brake my flesh and bring it into submission. If my marriage would have destroyed me, God would have broken my leg, if necessary, to hold me back from marriage, but He permitted me to make the choice and then He used my choice to bring me to obedience.

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SPURGEON'S CONVERSION

(taken from a booklet called Spurgeon, glorious Spurgeon, written by James Alexander Steward, D.D.)

Very few children have come under such deep conviction of sin as did young Charles. In writing of this experience, he says:

Oh, the many times I have wished that the preacher would tell me something to do to be saved! Gladly would I have done it, if it had been possible. If he had said, "Take off your shoes and stockings and run to John O'Groats," I would not even have gone home first, but would have started off that very night, if I might win salvation. How often have I thought that if he had said, "Bare your back to the scourge and take fifty lashes," I would have said, "Here I am; come along with your whip and beat as hard as you please, so long as I can obtain peace and rest and get rid of my sin." Yet, the simplest of all matters - believing in Christ crucified, accepting His finished salvation, being nothing, and letting Him be everything, doing nothing, but to trust Him for what He had done - I could not get hold of it.

Then came the re-letter day of January 6, 1850, when Spurgeon arose before dawn to pray and to read one of his bedside books. He could find no rest. As he himself said, God was ploughing his soul, ten black horses in His team - the Ten Commandments - and cross-ploughing it with the message of the gospel, but when he heard it, no comfort came to his soul. He had been to many gospel meetings and various churches but in vain, and had it not been for the goodness of God in sending a snowstorm one Sunday morning, he might have still wandered in darkness and despair, he says. The storm hindered his reaching the place of worship whither he was bound and instead, he turned into the Primitive Methodist Chapel, Artillery Street, Colchester. There were a dozen or fifteen persons in the chapel - no more. The preacher man mounted the pulpit. To this very day no one knows who he was or even his name. I have often thought that one of the first things Charles Spurgeon would do when he reached Gloryland would be to ask

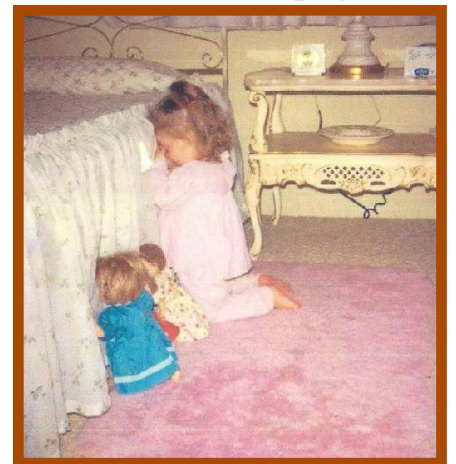
the Saviour to introduce him to the man who preached that morning!

The test was, "Look unto Me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth," (Isaiah 45:22). For the first time in Spurgeon's young life he began to see God's simple way of salvation. As he later recalled it with his remarkable verbal memory, the sermon ran something like this.

My dear friends, this is a simple text indeed. It says, "Look." Now lookin' don't take a deal of pains. It ain't liftin' your foot or your finger. It is just "Look." Well, a man needn't go to college to learn to look. You may be the biggest fool, and yet you can look. A man needn't be worth a thousand a year to be able to look. Anyone can look; even a child can look. But then the text says, "Look unto Me." Aye! Many on ye are lookin' to yourselves. Some look to God the Father. No, look to Him bye and bye. Jesus Christ says, "Look unto Me!" Some of ye say "We must wait for the Spirit's workin'." You have no business with that just now. Look to Christ; the text says, "Look unto Me."

He had about reached the end of something to say when suddenly he fixed his eyes on young Charles sitting in the gallery and, pointing straight at him, said, "Young man, you look very miserable. You always will be miserable - miserable in life and miserable

He was saying to the clerk, "These young kids today have no ideal what it was like to go through the depression!" I tapped him on the shoulder and said, "Sir, you may have already gone through your depression, but some of us have just begun ours." He looked into my little basket and realized where I was coming from. He began to apologize to me and his whole attitude changed. You see, everyone is not where you are in life. When you are hurting, many are laughing. When you are laughing, many are hurting. Be sensitive to others. Everyday we ate a weenie and a half of a baked potato. Jerry said, "If we ever get out of this mess I don't every want to see a weenie again!" Today his favorite food is hot dogs. Time changes things.

God has tested my faith with the places He has asked me to live. At 60 years of age, I had moved 63 times in my life! I have lived in every type of home you can think of. I had a

dream home in my mind all of those years and now, after the trying of my faith, God has given me my dream home! It is a little farm house, very simple, with nine acres of land. I always wanted a place that had a well. I may have the only house in Dallas that has a well! God cares about our desires.

I have some very big items that I am trusting the Lord, by faith, to provide at this time of my life. I have no desire to go ahead of the Lord and attempt to provide these things without Him. He owns it all and He will do what is best for me concerning these things, just like He has taken care of me all these years. When our faith is tested, it brings praise, honour and glory to the Lord. Anybody can live by sight and have a dull, everyday drudgery of a life. But to live by faith is never dull or boring.

What are you trusting the Lord to do in your life? Right it out on a piece of paper, date it and lay it before the Lord everyday. Then watch for His leading. Read Hebrews 11 and see all the things people received by faith. God will provide!!!
